

THIS IS THE STORY

- Nikolaj Hess is a Danish jazz pianist and composer. His partnership with violinist Cæcilie Balling dates back to 2015 and in 2019, he wrote the violin concerto *Melody* for Balling's soloist debut at the Royal Academy of Music in Aarhus.
- In the concert, **subtle impressions from jazz** meld into an otherwise fully orchestrated work for solo violin and chamber ensemble, which, unusually, features **a discreet rhythm section** of drums and double bass.
- Hess himself says about his violin concerto *Melody*: 'I wanted to create something **Nordic with a global perspective**.' In Hess' music, one senses both luminous narrative delight and a **distinctive melancholy**.
- The movement *Birds* draws inspiration from trancsriptions of bird songs, capturing the lyrical beauty of nature. In *Waves*, we hear an underlying Nordic melancholy which may evoke associations with Grieg and Sibelius.
- In the fourth movement, the music ventures into a collectively improvised zone which is continued in the **freely improvised solo cadenza** in the fifth movement.
- In the final movement, the music finds its redemptive conclusion, in Balling's words evoking Mahler with a poignant melody that goes straight to the heart.
